The Awards Exhibition in Floor One went ahead with due consideration to Covid restrictions. David Newell, our Exhibitions Officer, did an excellent job, and the hanging, dismantling and general organisation went smoothly, although some chasing of people to man the sales desk was required. We had over 30 exhibitors, and 7 paintings, 5 browser works and a fair number of cards were sold. Sadly the gallery & museum was very understaffed, and it shows; their future direction is unclear.
