After a brief introduction she began a live demonstration, going through the preparation, cutting and printing processes as we all watched via video on the large screen. By the end of the evening we had a delightful print of a cottage, and lots of useful tips and information about handprinting. This was an excellent evening, with lots to learn for beginners and experts alike, and the unanimous burst of applause at the end was well-deserved.

Houlton Show notes

Entries are now closed for the Awards Show at Houlton Barn on Saturday & Sunday 19th & 20th November. There are nine awards and the judges will be artist (and composer) Adam Tucker from Coventry, Northamptonshire artist Anna Steiner, and Hannah Craig representing Houlton.

Due to time restrictions we cannot enter the venue until 8.30pm on Friday, so we will be grateful for any help that members can give in erecting the show after then. Help will also be needed to dismantle the show at 4pm on Sunday.

Work should be handed in at Houlton Barn at 8.30pm on Friday, or if you prefer between 6pm & 8pm at Dunchurch Village Hall – also on Friday.

Work should be collected after 4pm on Sunday, or if it is to be shown at the Floor One exhibition, we can store it for you and deliver to Floor One for hanging. (see Floor One notes).

Floor One Show notes

The Floor One exhibition will be open to the public from Saturday 26 November to Thursday 8 December. It will not be monitored so for security all work should be framed and suitable for wall-mounting using mirror plates attached by the exhibition helpers. There will be no browsers, 3-dimensional work or cards.

Only fully paid-up R&DAS members can exhibit and a payment of £10 payment per person will be required. Up to three pictures can be entered, of which at least two will be exhibited, subject to suitable framing.

You can pay in advance at the Houlton hand-in or collection, or by contacting our Treasurer, Gill Dakin, at martinandgilld@gmail.com. Alternatively, payment will be accepted at the hand-in for the Floor One exhibition itself with card payment welcomed. Entries should be handed in at the Floor One gallery on Friday 25 November between 12 noon & 1.30pm. Work shown previously at Houlton will be acceptable as will any other suitable framed wall art.

Plain cards will be provided for you to enter the title, media, price (if for sale or not) and other details including your contact details. Alternative contact details will be available if you don't want to provide your own. No commission will be charged on sales.

Volunteers to hang work on Friday afternoon are required and your help will be much appreciated. Collection of works will be on Friday 9 December 11am -12noon. For further information contact Paul Torr on 01788 579982

Lea Nixon Workshop

A watercolour workshop with watercolour artist Lea Nixon was held at Learnington Hastings Parish Hall on 22nd October.

The event was a great success with 16 artists attending. Lea demonstrated his technique, stressing the importance of tonal values, firstly by painting a Spanish scene (bright sun) in grey to emphasize the tones, light against dark, then the same scene in colour. Then we had to do it!

We took a picnic lunches but drinks and biscuits were provided throughout the day. To start the afternoon session Lea demonstrated light against light which then had to do! We all felt we had learnt a lot but enjoyed the day too- Lea claims he enjoyed too!
